**Michael E. Mangino received his BS, MS and PhD from Michigan State University, the latter in 1976 in Food Science under the mentorship of Dr. J. Robert Brunner. From there, he went on to The Ohio State University where he became Full Professor in 1989. From 1985-1986, Mike was a Visiting Scientist at the Dairy Research Laboratory, CSIRO, Highett, Victoria, Australia.**

**While at Ohio State, he distinguished himself as an outstanding researcher, with emphasis on functionality of whey proteins, resulting in over 50 peer reviewed publications and countless oral presentations. In addition to his achievements in research, he has been acclaimed as an outstanding teacher receiving the IFT Cruess Award for Excellence in Teaching, the Outstanding Undergraduate Academic Advisor from Ohio State University, and he is a member of the OSU College of Agriculture Academy of Teaching. He is a member of the American Dairy Science Association, the Institute of Food Technologists and the American Chemical Society. For the duration of the J. R. Brunner Protein Symposium, Dr. Mangino was a frequent organizer, speaker and chair of sessions. In the words of Dr. Brunner, "He has had an outstanding teaching career, considerable administrative experience and a good research effort, especially in the functionality of whey proteins."**
